Keynote Speaker: Marilyn Haskel is a career church musician: organist, choir director, liturgist, and composer. She was Program Manager for Liturgical Arts and New Initiatives in Music and the Arts for Trinity Wall Street; served as Cantor at the historic St. Paul's Chapel from 2006 to 2014; has been a workshop leader for Music that Makes Community. Her first love is congregational singing and so she is active in the Hymn Society and Melodious Accord where she works with Alice Parker.





Making Music with Small Choirs: Ellen Johnston is the Director of the Center for Liturgy and Music at Virginia Theological

Seminary, where she writes for the Center's website (liturgyandmusic.org) and consults with parishes of all sizes. She has served churches in Mississippi and Virginia in a career spanning over thirty years. She is the past Chair of the Music and Liturgy Commission of the Diocese of Virginia, a member of the Central Virginia Board for the Leadership Program for Musicians, and leads workshops in Virginia and elsewhere, primarily focusing on worship renewal and music in small congregations. She currently serves as Director of Music at the Church of the Holy Comforter in Richmond.

Creative Use of Hand Bells in Worship: Beau Lochte is a musician, teacher, composer & conductor with a degree in music composition from Towson University. In addition to directing the chancel handbell choir and youth handchimes programs at Second Presbyterian, he is Artistic Director and founder of Charm City Bronze, an independent handbell ensemble, and directs the handbell choir at the Cathedral of the Incarnation. Mr. Lochte currently teaches over 20 piano students and arranges original, keyboard, pop and orchestral music for handbells and regularly performs as a solo handbell ringer and in small ensembles.
